








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THE WEEK THAT WAS IN PICTURES...

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TRANSITION INFORMATION

Although it is only May and the 2024 school year seems a long way off, transition processes for students who will be in Foundation or Year 7 in 2024 have started.

Foundation Enrolments for 2024

A new state-wide timeline for enrolling in Foundation for the 2024 school year has been released by the Department of Education. The timeline will apply for children starting Foundation in 2024 and all government primary schools will follow the new timeline. If you are enrolling a student in Foundation at Willowmavin PS in 2024, or know someone who is, please submit an enrolment application by 28th July 2023. Applications can be collected from the office. The Department has created an

enrolment information pack for Foundation families with further details and key dates.

Key Dates

- 1. Submit an enrolment application for Foundation by Friday 28th July 2023.
- 2. Receive notification of the outcome of your application by Friday 11th August 2023. If you receive an enrolment offer, please accept the offer by Friday 25th August 2023.
- 3. Take part in enrolment information and transition sessions in 2023.

Grade 6 to Year Transition

At the opposite end of the primary school experience, our Grade 6 students and their families received a transition pack last week. Please return these to Willowmavin PS by Thursday 11th May. The Department of Education has created a factsheet for the Grade 6 to Year 7 placement process. This document includes a detailed timeline of the process.

Helmet rules for bikes, scooters & skateboards

Cyclists aren't the only ones who need to strap on a helmet. This is when and where you need to wear a helmet in Victoria.

Mandatory helmet laws have been in place in Victoria for more than 30 years. Since then, they've been expanded to include new forms of transport such as e-scooters and other electric personal transportation devices.

In Victoria, all cyclists, scooters and electronic personal transportation (e-scooters, electric unicycle, segways, etc.) riders must wear a helmet. This rule applies to all ages whenever you're riding in a public place such as on the road, in a bicycle lane, on a shared path, in carparks, on the footpath and even in parks. Even passengers on a bike are legally required to wear a bike helmet. Equestrians should also note that it is mandatory for horse riders aged under 18 to wear a helmet when riding their animal on the

If you don't wear an approved helmet while riding, police have the power to stop you and issue either a warning or a fine. Fines for failing to wear a helmet can range from \$231 to \$925, depending on the breach and whether the matter goes to court.

road, footpath or a road related area.

Those using a non-electric wheeled recreation device, such as a skateboard, roller skates or rollerblades (not scooters) are not required by law to wear a helmet. However, it is recommended to wear a helmet and other safety equipment such as knee pads and elbow pads if you are using one of these devices.

Interstate laws can vary - check with local authorities for clarification. For more information, refer

Pedestrians and e-Scooters

There have been a high number of incidents of pedestrians being hit by e-Scooters on the Council trials of e-scooters, which can result in serious injuries, and can be fatal for the pedestrian. Despite this, the trials are continuing and expanding into other council areas.

Strict trial road safety rules apply to both commercial and private e-scooters. Victoria totally prohibits e-scooters on footpaths and riders who violate this rule will be subject to penalties. The evidence gathered during the e-scooter trials highlight the safety risks when riders do not follow safety-based rules. You can legally ride an e-scooter in Victoria but the following conditions apply:

- You ride on shared-use paths and roads up to and including 60km/h;
- You are at least 16 years old;
- You wear a properly fitted approved bicycle helmet;
- You do not travel more than 20km/h
- You do not use your mobile phone;
- You do not ride while intoxicated; and
- You do not carry a passenger.

E-scooters, like bicycles, are not covered by TAC insurance for accidents with other e-scooters, pedestrians or other incidents where no other vehicle was involved. It is recommended that the owner take out their own insurance to cover them against any costs incurred as a result of an accident caused by the rider.

The main issue for pedestrian safety is the high number of escooters being ridden on footpaths. Although an e-scooter is not permitted to ride on a footpath, they are allowed to ride on a shared footpath. In order for pedestrians to be safer, we recommend pedestrians:

- Always keep an eye out for e-scooters when exiting a building; and
- Check for e-scooters as well as all other hazards before crossing a shared path, bicycle lane or a road.

All devices that use lithium-ion batteries pose a potential fire risk. E-scooters should be charged and stored away from walk ways, especially ones used in case of emergency, and used batteries should be disposed of according to manufacturer's instructions. The battery of an e-scooter which may have been damaged in an accident should be disposed of safely and immediately.
